

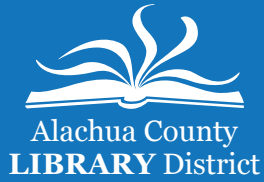
Who We Are

The Alachua County Library District is an independent special taxing district located in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area in North Central Florida. It is the sole provider of public library services within Alachua County (as established by Chapter 98-502, as amended by 03-376, Laws of Florida).

The Library District serves 267,306 Alachua County residents, 60 percent live in incorporated areas and 40 percent in unincorporated areas of the county. Incorporated municipalities include Gainesville (county seat), Alachua, Archer, Hawthorne, High Springs, LaCrosse, Micanopy, Newberry and Waldo.

The Library District includes a Headquarters Library (downtown Gainesville) and large branches Millhopper Branch (northwest Gainesville) and Tower Road Branch (unincorporated southwest Gainesville). Also located in Gainesville are the Library Partnership and Cone Park branches which house neighborhood resource centers. Additional branches reside in these municipalities: Alachua, Archer, Hawthorne, High Springs, Micanopy, Newberry and Waldo. The Library District's eBranch oversees its website and virtual branch. The Library District operates two bookmobiles and provides library services to the Alachua County Jail.

Through reciprocal borrowing agreements, Library District patrons may borrow free of charge from public library systems in these surrounding counties: Baker, Bradford, Clay, Columbia, Dixie, Gilchrist, Lafayette, Levy, Marion, Putnam, St. Johns, Taylor and Union.

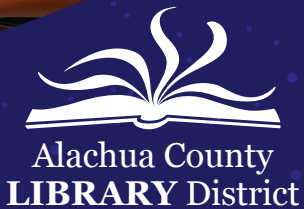

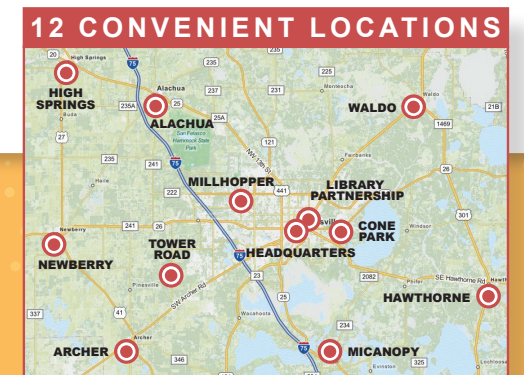
